

manager of the football team to director of alumni affairs. Until his death in 1995, he was the only person who had attended every Alabama bowl game, starting with the Rose Bowl on January 1, 1926. In 1990 he was honored when the University renamed Coleman Coliseum after him. In addition, he served Delta Chi nationally in various capacities, most notably as "AA" from 1954 to 1956. For his meritorious and conspicuous service, Jeff was inducted into the Fraternity's highest order, the Order of the White Carnation.

Walt Granger was honored in 1998 as the first recipient of a Coleman Award for his more than half-century of meritorious service

to the Chapter and his outstanding career as a mining engineer and teacher. Other distinguished recipients are: Bill Mace, Dr. Noah Langdale, Rick Manley, Jim Page, General Larry Northington, Judge Robert Vance, Bill Crawford, Jon Vice, Dr. Carden Johnston, Dr. George Rudd, Stephen Kennamer and Dr. Jack Whetstone.

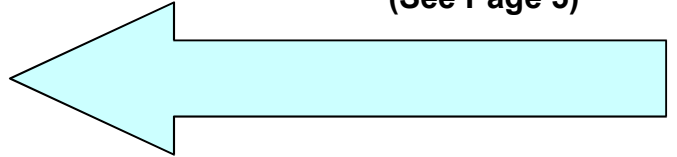
